The NC Board of Dietetics/Nutrition currently has 3,287 Active licensees. Rule Changes

As was noted in our spring newsletter, in the fall of 2018 the NCBDN began work on rule changes in order to address the statutory changes that went into effect July 1, 2018. Effective August 1, 2018 changes to 21 NCAC 17. 0104 – Applications; 21 NCAC 17. 0105 – Examination for Licensure; 21 NCAC 17. 0107 - Provisional License; and 21 NCAC 17. 0109 - Issuance and Renewal of License, were made part of the North Carolina Administrative Code. The NCBDN encourages all licensees, especially licensees supervising students in their supervised practice experiences, to review these revised regulations, which you can [find here](#).

The NCBDN continues to work on revisions to rules 21 NCAC 17. 0101 – Definitions, and 17. 0303 – Supervision, and hopes to also start work on additional updates to other rules this winter. One can always find information on proposed rule changes on our website under the tab “Laws & Rules.”

Open Board Positions

The NCBDN will have two open licensed dietitian/nutritionist (LDN) seats on the Board effective July 1, 2020. The NCBDN position of clinical dietitian/nutritionist will be one of the seats that comes open effective July 1, 2020. In order to serve in the clinical position, one must be a dietitian/nutritionist whose primary practice is clinical dietetics or nutrition in a hospital or long-term care institution. Additionally, an LDN seat for a dietitian/nutritionist practicing in any area of dietetics/nutrition will also come open effective July 1, 2020.

Members of the Board are appointed to three-year terms, and may be reappointed once consecutively. Appointees must have practiced in the field of dietetics or nutrition for at least three years. The Board office is currently located in Cary, NC. Board members may participate in board meetings in-person or electronically.
